ARTS CENTRE

The Arts Centre is a flexible arts space comprising two galleries, an art shop, performance space, rehearsal rooms and a visual art studio. It is home to several local arts groups and is very much a part of the local community.

To support local artists and the community, the Arts Centre delivers an annual program of exhibitions, events, arts workshops and performances. Events and activities reflect local history, character and culture, positively contributing to the identity and vibrancy of our community.

Located within the beautiful seaside suburb of Port Noarlunga, a visit to the Arts Centre can be combined with a short walk to the Onkaparinga River, the beach and a visit to the many cafés and shops in the township.

The Arts Centre is in the old institute building on Gawler Street. The institute opened in 1924, and has since played an important role in the creative and cultural life of the region; for many years as a performance space and previously as one of the only movie theatres in the Fleurieu Peninsula.

This role is continued today through the Arts Centre, as a hub for the arts in the south. The centre blends support for local artists with a mix of entertainers and performances from outside the region. This provides the community with access to shows they may not otherwise have an opportunity to experience.

Annual, signature events now include the Beanie to Berets exhibition and its associated Textile Market in winter, along with the Surf Art Exhibition and Surf Art Christmas Market, and the annual Reconciliation Week Concert.

The performance space, rehearsal rooms and visual arts studio are available for hire, for the presentation of performances, events, workshops and functions, with technical and event management support available from the Arts Centre team.

We acknowledge the Kaurna Nation and its people as the traditional owners and custodians of the land in the area now known as the City of Onkaparinga. We recognise that this local living culture has developed over tens of thousands of years and that in today's contemporary context, Kaurna and other Aboriginal people are actively engaged in community life and bring their rich cultural heritage to the strong, vibrant communities we strive for.



Onkaparinga Gallery: 15 March – 29 April

This exhibition brings together two bodies of work that explore the complex feelings and emotions that are experienced in life, underpinned by the events, interactions and relationships that shape our existence.

Transience presents aging as a paradigm, suggesting that as we age, relevance is replaced with nostalgic ideals. This series of paintings explores feelings of loss, melancholy, love and courage, reflective of a life lived.

Small Calamities presents a series of sculptures that use a simple duality of spheres and cubes to represent the critical events, interactions and relationships that provoke emotional responses and influence our experience of life.

The contrast between the mediums offers an exhibition that is simultaneously representative of tradition and culture and self-reflective interpretation.



Fields of McLaren Vale

SELECTED WORKS FROM THE CITY OF ONKAPARINGA ART COLLECTION

Stump Hill Gallery, McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre 21 June – 28 July

The title for this exhibition comes from the 2009 work by John Hamilton, illustrated here, and acquired for the City of Onkaparinga Art Collection in the same year.

Fields of McLaren Vale captures a familiar scene when travelling though the township and its surrounds, with its rolling hills, lines of grape vines, grouping of trees and cylindrical hay bales, along with industrial and domestic structures.

Other works in the exhibition capture familiar scenes synonymous with McLaren Vale and the surrounding area, including views of vines looking

out to the sea, plantings and vines at different seasons, harvest time, quarries, and general lookout views of the area.

The City of Onkaparinga's Art Collection is a vibrant, collective representation of place and concepts, as expressed by many artists who have lived, and continue to live and work in the area, allowing our communities to experience and connect with our history and culture through the artworks it contains.






Textile Market

Onkaparinga Gallery: 9 August – 9 September

Monika Morgenstern's art delves deeply into the idea of the numinous in an ethereal and atmospheric abstract manner and she invites you to an encounter with the unknown.

Colour and its perceptual potency have been a longstanding preoccupation in Morgenstern's work and she is interested in exploring it as a carrier of meaning with explicit reference to concepts of the spiritual and the 'blur'.

Inspired by the German philosophical tradition of the ineffable, her work investigates colour as a gateway to the unknown. In particular, the communicative power and ethereal states of colour in different forms of matter. Colour is presented as a luminous image in solid form and through veils of glass. The effect is immersive and provides a highly sensory experience for audiences.

With the art of self-expression by older people at its core, this exhibition delves into the thoughtfulness, joy, learning and interpretations of the artists, as each one develops their own creative style.



Scrap Metal Waters

BADEN LLOYD

Onkaparinga Gallery: 8 November – 9 December

Baden Lloyd is a creative recycled metal artist and sculptor. For this exhibition, he has immersed himself in the depths of the ocean's mysteries.

With an array of reclaimed corrugated iron, Baden has crafted a school of fish that dance through the currents, each piece telling a story of resilience as the corrugated iron symbolises strength of nature's ability to adapt and endure.

A family of stingrays and other sea creatures that can be found floating through sea grass, near the sandy ocean floor, will be sculpted from a blend of recycled metals, aiming to capture the fluidity, elegance and diversity of the underwater world.



Surf Art Exhibition

Onkaparinga Gallery and Red Rover Gallery 13 December – 3 February 2025

Surf 2024 celebrates the region's surfing culture, lifestyle, history and stunning coastal environment.

Marking the beginning of summer, the annual exhibition has carved a place in the hearts and souls of the southern arts calendar and has become one of the pivotal features of the Arts Centre's program.

The Surf 2024 art exhibition is open to all Australian artists celebrating the ocean, coastal environment and surfing culture.
